All about food allergy is a free, medically-reviewed and curriculum-linked program for grades 4 to 6 that will help develop the knowledge and skills students need to support the health and well-being of self and others.



The impact of this program: Why it's important

Food allergy affects over 600,000 Canadian children, equivalent to 3 children in a classroom of 30.

With a medical condition connected to food, preventing reactions and staying safe is a shared

responsibility. Yet, research shows kids with food allergy face bullying and social exclusion solely because of their medical condition, and that there are substantial gaps in the understanding and management of food allergy.

Through the "All about food allergy" program, teachers can play a pivotal role in significantly closing these gaps and empowering the next generation.

- ✓ **Drama**

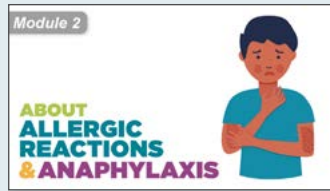
Plus, there are suggested extensions for more integrations, including **Mathematics** and **Visual Arts**.

Lesson plans and introduction to the program



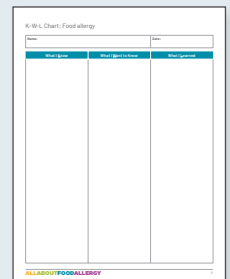
Support activities

K-W-L charts as the formative assessment for this program



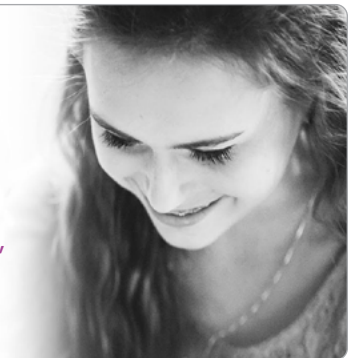
